

Ordinance No. 8047

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR PAVEMENT MARKINGS

WHEREAS, the City Engineer solicited bids to supply labor, equipment, fuel, and materials to refresh center lines, edge lines, lane lines, and channel lines on public streets throughout the city in accordance with plans and material specifications on file as Engineering Division Project No. 1814; and,

WHEREAS, Zimmerman Paint Contractors Co. of Fremont, Ohio submitted the lowest *responsive* and responsible bid in the amount of \$46,497.56; and,

WHEREAS, Council finds that annual pavement marking supports a safe and reliable transportation network for City residents;

Now therefore, be it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Administrator is authorized to award a contract to Zimmerman Paint Contractors Co. in the amount of \$46,497.56 to apply pavement markings conforming to the plans and specifications established by the solicitation at the prices and on the terms and conditions of performance of the accepted bid.

Section 2: The Finance Director is directed to pay costs of the contract authorized by Section 1 from Line 202-901-5-2-980.882 of the 2018 annual budget.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all legislative actions pertaining to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in Public Session and that all deliberations that affected or influenced any such legislative act, including all deliberations in Committee, were conducted in Public Session or in Executive Session duly convened in accordance with law.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall be effective on the earliest date permitted by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 8048

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$215,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING COSTS OF ACQUIRING AN AMBULANCE, INCLUDING RELATED EQUIPMENT AND APPARATUS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Finance Director, as fiscal officer of the City, has certified to this Council that the estimated life or period of usefulness of the improvement described in Section 2 is at least five years and the estimated maximum maturity of the Bonds described in Section 2 is 10 years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, that:

Section 1. Definitions. In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Ordinance, unless the context or use clearly indicates another or different meaning or intent:

“Authorized Denominations” means the denomination of \$100,000 or any whole multiple of \$1,000 in excess thereof.

“Bond proceedings” means, collectively, this Ordinance, the Certificate of Award and such other proceedings of the City, including the Bonds, that provide collectively for, among other things, the rights of holders and beneficial owners of the Bonds.

“Bond Register” means all books and records necessary for the registration, exchange and transfer of Bonds as provided in Section 5.

“Bond Registrar” means the Fiscal Officer.

“Certificate of Award” means the certificate authorized by Section 6(a), to be signed by the Fiscal Officer, setting forth and determining those terms or other matters pertaining to the Bonds and their issuance, sale and delivery as this Ordinance requires or authorizes to be set forth or determined therein.

“Closing Date” means the date of physical delivery of, and payment of the purchase price for, the Bonds.

“Code” means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, the Regulations (whether temporary or final) under that Code or the statutory predecessor of that Code, and any amendments of, or successor provisions to, the foregoing and any official rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and judicial determinations regarding any of the foregoing, all as and to the extent applicable. Unless otherwise indicated, reference to a Section of the Code includes any applicable successor section or provision and such applicable Regulations, rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and determinations pertinent to that Section.

“Fiscal Officer” means the Finance Director of the City.

“Interest Payment Dates” means, unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, June 1 and December 1 of each year that the Bonds are outstanding, commencing June 1, 2019.

“Mayor” means the Mayor of the City.

“Original Purchaser” means the original purchaser of the Bonds designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award.

“Principal Payment Dates” means unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, December 1 in the years from and including 2019 to and including 2023, provided that in no case shall the final Principal Payment Date be later than the maximum maturity of the Bonds referred to in the preambles hereto.

Section 2. Authorized Principal Amount and Purpose; Application of Proceeds. This Council determines that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City to issue bonds of the City as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$215,000 (the Bonds) for the purpose of paying costs of acquiring an ambulance, including related equipment and apparatus, together with the necessary appurtenances thereto, including the payment of expenses related to the issuance of the Bonds.

Subject to the limitations set forth in this Ordinance, the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued, the principal maturities of and the principal payment schedule for the Bonds, the interest rate or rates that the Bonds shall bear and certain other terms and provisions of the Bonds identified in this Ordinance are subject to further specification or determination in the Certificate of Award upon the finalization of the terms and provisions of the Bonds. The aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be issued, as so specified by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, shall be the aggregate principal amount of Bonds required to be issued, taking into account any premium above or discount from the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds at which they are sold to the Original Purchaser, in order to effect the purpose for which the Bonds are to be issued, including the payment of any expenses properly allocable to the issuance of the Bonds.

The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds received by the City shall be paid into the proper fund or funds, and those proceeds are appropriated and shall be used for the purpose for which the Bonds are being issued. Any portion of those proceeds received by the City representing premium (after payment of financing costs) or accrued interest shall be paid into the Bond Retirement Fund.

Section 3. Denominations; Dating; Principal and Interest Payment and Prepayment Provisions. The Bonds shall be issued as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$215,000. The Bonds shall be dated as provided in the Certificate of Award, provided that their dated date shall not be more than 60 days prior to the Closing Date.

(a) Interest Rates and Interest Payment Dates. The Bonds shall bear interest at the rate or rates per year (computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of 12 30-day months) as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable at such rate or rates on the Interest Payment Dates until the principal amount has been paid or provided for. The Bonds shall bear interest from the most recent date to which interest has been paid or provided for or, if no interest has been paid or provided for, from their date.

(b) Principal Payment Schedule. The Bonds shall mature on the Principal Payment Dates in principal amounts as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer, subject to subsection (c) of this Section, in the Certificate of Award, consistent with the Fiscal Officer's determination of the best interest of and financial advantages to the City.

(c) Conditions for Establishment of Interest Rates and Principal Payment Dates and Amounts. The rate or rates of interest per year to be borne by the Bonds, and the principal amount of Bonds maturing on each Principal Payment Date, shall be such that (i) the total principal and interest payments on the Bonds in any fiscal year in which principal is payable is not more than three times the amount of those payments in any other such fiscal year and (ii) the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%.

(d) Payment of Debt Charges. The debt charges on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for the services of the Bond Registrar as paying agent. Principal of the Bonds shall be payable when due upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar. Interest on a Bond shall be paid on each Interest Payment Date by check or draft mailed to the person in whose name the Bond was registered, and to that person's address appearing, on the Bond Register at the close of business on the 15th day preceding that Interest Payment Date. Notwithstanding the foregoing, so long as the Original Purchaser is the registered owner of the Bonds, (i) the principal installments on the Bonds may be paid on each Principal Payment Date and any prepayment date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner, provided that in connection with the payment or prepayment of the final installment of principal of the Bonds, the registered owner thereof shall present and surrender its Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar, and (ii) interest on the Bonds may be paid on each Interest Payment Date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available

funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner.

(e) Prepayment. If agreed to by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds shall be prepayable, in whole or in part, with or without penalty or premium, at the option of the City at any time or a specific time prior to maturity, each as designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award and as provided in this Ordinance. Prepayment prior to maturity shall be made by deposit with the Bond Registrar of the principal amount of the Bonds then to be prepaid, together with interest accrued thereon to the date of prepayment. The City's right of prepayment shall be exercised by mailing a notice of prepayment, stating the date of prepayment and the name and address of the Bond Registrar, by certified or registered mail to the registered owners of the Bonds to be prepaid, and at their addresses, each as shown on the Bond Register at the close of business on the day preceding the mailing of the notice. The notice shall be mailed not less than 30 days prior to the date of that deposit, unless that notice is waived by the registered owner(s) of the Bonds. If moneys for prepayment are on deposit with the Bond Registrar on the specified prepayment date following the giving of that notice (unless the requirement of that notice is waived as stated above), interest on the principal amount prepaid shall cease to accrue on the prepayment date, and upon the request of the Fiscal Officer the registered owner(s) of the Bonds shall arrange for the delivery of the Bonds to the Bond Registrar for prepayment and surrender and cancellation.

Section 4. Execution and Authentication of Bonds. The Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer, in the name of the City and in their official capacities, provided that either or both of those signatures may be a facsimile. The Bonds shall be issued in the Authorized Denominations and numbers as requested by the Original Purchaser and approved by the Fiscal Officer, shall be numbered as determined by the Fiscal Officer in order to distinguish each Bond from any other Bond, and shall express upon their faces the purpose, in summary terms, for which they are issued and that they are issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 133 of the Revised Code, this Ordinance and the Certificate of Award; provided, however, that, if requested by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds may be issued as a single registered Bond with multiple maturities of principal in Authorized Denominations as set forth in a payment schedule to be set forth in such Bond or attached thereto.

No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any security or benefit under the Bond proceedings unless and until the certificate of authentication printed on the Bond is signed by the Bond Registrar as authenticating agent. Authentication by the Bond Registrar shall be conclusive evidence that the Bond so authenticated has been duly issued, signed and delivered under, and is entitled to the security and benefit of, the Bond proceedings. The certificate of authentication may be signed by any authorized officer or employee of the Bond Registrar or by any other person acting as an agent of the Bond Registrar and approved by the Fiscal Officer on behalf of the City. The same person need not sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Bonds.

Section 5. Registration; Transfer and Exchange.

(a) Bond Registrar. So long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding, the City will cause the Bond Registrar to maintain and keep the Bond Register at the office satisfactory to the Fiscal Officer and the Bond Registrar. The person in whose name a Bond is registered on the Bond Register shall be regarded as the absolute owner of that Bond for all purposes of the Bond proceedings. Payment of or on account of the debt charges on any Bond shall be made only to or upon the order of that person; neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be affected by any notice to the contrary, but the registration may be changed as provided in this Section. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the City's liability upon the Bond, including interest, to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

(b) Transfer and Exchange. Any Bond may be exchanged for Bonds of any Authorized Denomination upon presentation and surrender at the office of the Bond Registrar, together with a request for exchange signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. A Bond may be transferred only on the Bond Register upon presentation and surrender of the Bond at the office of the Bond Registrar together with an assignment signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. Upon exchange or transfer the Bond Registrar shall complete, authenticate and deliver a new Bond or Bonds of any Authorized Denomination or

Denominations requested by the owner equal in the aggregate to the unmatured principal amount of the Bond surrendered and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date.

If manual signatures on behalf of the City are required, the Bond Registrar shall undertake the exchange or transfer of Bonds only after the new Bonds are signed by the authorized officers of the City. In all cases of Bonds exchanged or transferred, the City shall sign and the Bond Registrar shall authenticate and deliver Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Bond proceedings. The exchange or transfer shall be without charge to the owner, except that the City and Bond Registrar may make a charge sufficient to reimburse them for any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the exchange or transfer. The City or the Bond Registrar may require that those charges, if any, be paid before the procedure is begun for the exchange or transfer. All Bonds issued and authenticated upon any exchange or transfer shall be valid obligations of the City, evidencing the same debt, and entitled to the same security and benefit under the Bond proceedings as the Bonds surrendered upon that exchange or transfer. Neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be required to make any exchange or transfer of (i) Bonds then subject to call for prepayment between the 15th day preceding the mailing of notice of Bonds to be prepaid and the date of that mailing, or (ii) any Bond selected for prepayment, in whole or in part.

Section 6. Sale of the Bonds.

(a) Original Purchaser Designated in Certificate of Award. The Bonds shall be sold to the Original Purchaser at a purchase price, not less than 97% of their aggregate principal amount, to be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, plus accrued interest on the Bonds from their date to the Closing Date, and shall be awarded by the Fiscal Officer with and upon such other terms as are required or authorized by this Ordinance to be specified in the Certificate of Award, in accordance with law and the provisions of this Ordinance. The Fiscal Officer is authorized, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the City, to combine the issue of Bonds with one or more other bond issues of the City into a consolidated bond issue pursuant to Section 133.30(B) of the Revised Code in which case a single Certificate of Award may be utilized for the consolidated bond issue if appropriate and consistent with the terms of this Ordinance.

The Fiscal Officer shall sign and deliver the Certificate of Award and shall cause the Bonds to be prepared and signed and delivered, together with a true transcript of proceedings with reference to the issuance of the Bonds, to the Original Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price. The Mayor, the Fiscal Officer, the Law Director, the Clerk of Council and other City officials, as appropriate, each are authorized and directed to sign any transcript certificates, financial statements and other documents and instruments and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance.

(b) Financing Costs. The expenditure of the amounts necessary to pay the financing costs (as defined in Section 133.01 of the Revised Code) in connection with the Bonds is authorized and approved, and the Fiscal Officer is authorized to provide for the payment of any such amounts and costs from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise from any other funds lawfully available that are appropriated or shall be appropriated for that purpose.

Section 7. Provisions for Tax Levy. There shall be levied on all the taxable property in the City, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period the Bonds are outstanding in an amount sufficient to pay the debt charges on the Bonds when due, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by Section 11 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution. The tax shall be within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law, shall be and is ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of those years are certified, levied, extended and collected, and shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The proceeds of the tax levy shall be placed in the Bond Retirement Fund, which is irrevocably pledged for the payment of the debt charges on the Bonds when and as the same fall due. In each year, to the extent other funds are available for the payment of debt charges on the Bonds and are appropriated for that purpose, the amount of the tax shall be reduced by the amount of other funds so available and appropriated.

Section 8. Federal Tax Considerations. The City covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Bonds in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Bonds will not (i) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Section 141, 148 or 149 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code), or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103 of the Code applies, and (b) the interest thereon will not be an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code.

The City further covenants that (a) it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of them for the interest on the Bonds to be and to remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (b) it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion and (c) it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the governmental purposes of the borrowing, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii) make timely and adequate payments to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The Fiscal Officer, or any other officer of the City having responsibility for the issuance of the Bonds is hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation (including designation of the Bonds as “qualified tax-exempt obligations” if such designation is applicable and desirable, and to make any related necessary representations and covenants), choice, consent, approval or waiver on behalf of the City with respect to the Bonds as the City is permitted or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections provided for in or available under Section 148 of the Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting the favorable tax treatment or status of the Bonds or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments or penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and signed by the officer, (b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the City, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Bonds, and (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the City, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the City regarding the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Bonds, the facts, circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Bonds.

Section 9. Certification and Delivery of Ordinance and Certificate of Award. The Clerk of Council is directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Ordinance and a signed copy of the Certificate of Award to the Defiance County Auditor.

Section 10. Satisfaction of Conditions for Bond Issuance. This Council determines that all acts and conditions necessary to be performed by the City or to have been met precedent to and in the issuing of the Bonds in order to make them legal, valid and binding general obligations of the City have been performed and have been met, or will at the time of delivery of the Bonds have been performed and have been met, in regular and due form as required by law; that the full faith and credit and general property taxing power (as described in Section 7) of the City are pledged for the timely payment of the debt charges on the Bonds; and that no statutory or constitutional limitation of indebtedness or taxation will have been exceeded in the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 11. Retention of Bond Counsel. The legal services of Squire Patton Boggs (US) LLP, as bond counsel, be and are hereby retained. The legal services shall be in the nature of legal advice and recommendations as to the documents and the proceedings in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the rendering of the necessary legal opinion upon the delivery of the Bonds. In rendering those legal services, as an independent contractor and in an attorney-client relationship, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those legal services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those legal services. The Fiscal Officer is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the

availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 12. Retention of Municipal Advisor. The services of Sudsina & Associates, LLC, as municipal advisor, be and are hereby retained. The municipal advisory services shall be in the nature of financial advice and recommendations in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. In rendering those municipal advisory services, as an independent contractor, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those municipal advisory services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those municipal advisory services. The Finance Director is authorized to provide for the payment of those fees and any reimbursements from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 13. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the enactment of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law.

Section 14. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings in this Ordinance are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof. Reference to a Section means a section of this Ordinance unless otherwise indicated.

Section 15. Declaration of Emergency; Effective Date. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to sell the Notes at the earliest possible date, which is necessary to make their proceeds available to enable the City to provide for the acquisition of an ambulance, which is needed to enhance City emergency medical services and thereby better protect the health and safety of the citizens of the City; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

Abstract of

Ordinance No. 8048

This is a summary of Ordinance No. 8048, enacted by the Council of the City of Defiance on August 14, 2018, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$215,000 for the purpose of paying costs of acquiring an ambulance, including related equipment and apparatus, together with the necessary appurtenances thereto.

The bonds are to be dated their date of issuance and to bear interest at a rate or rates such that the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%, and to mature in not more than 10 annual installments. The ordinance provides for sale of the bonds to the original purchaser designated by the Finance Director in a certificate of award, and authorizes the Finance Director to determine the principal amount of and interest rate or rates (subject to the above) on the bonds and their redemption features, if any. The ordinance provides for the manner of payment of the bonds, their form and signing and the application of the proceeds, and provides assurances of the City relating to the federal income tax status of the interest on the bonds. The ordinance also provides for the levy of a tax within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law on all the taxable property in the City while the bonds are outstanding, and that the bonds will be general obligations of the City, the full faith and credit and general property taxing power of which are pledged for the payment of principal and interest.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$265,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A PORTION OF THE COSTS OF IMPROVING SOUTH CLINTON STREET BY WIDENING, RECONSTRUCTING, GRADING, DRAINING, PAVING AND RESURFACING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 7845, enacted on August 23, 2016, there were issued \$500,000 of notes in anticipation of bonds for the purpose stated in Section 2 as part of a consolidated issue of \$2,205,000 Various Purpose Notes, Series 2016, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$375,000 of notes (the Outstanding Notes) issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7940, enacted on August 8, 2017, as part of a consolidated issue of \$2,330,000 Various Purpose Notes, Series 2017, which Outstanding Notes mature on September 20, 2018; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines that the City should retire the Outstanding Notes with the proceeds of the Bonds described in Section 2 and other funds available to the City; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director, as fiscal officer of the City, has certified to this Council that the estimated life or period of usefulness of the improvement described in Section 2 is at least five years and the estimated maximum maturity of the Bonds described in Section 2 is 20 years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, that:

Section 1. Definitions. In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Ordinance, unless the context or use clearly indicates another or different meaning or intent:

“Authorized Denominations” means the denomination of \$100,000 or any whole multiple of \$1,000 in excess thereof.

“Bond proceedings” means, collectively, this Ordinance, the Certificate of Award and such other proceedings of the City, including the Bonds, that provide collectively for, among other things, the rights of holders and beneficial owners of the Bonds.

“Bond Register” means all books and records necessary for the registration, exchange and transfer of Bonds as provided in Section 5.

“Bond Registrar” means the Fiscal Officer.

“Certificate of Award” means the certificate authorized by Section 6(a), to be signed by the Fiscal Officer, setting forth and determining those terms or other matters pertaining to the Bonds and their issuance, sale and delivery as this Ordinance requires or authorizes to be set forth or determined therein.

“Closing Date” means the date of physical delivery of, and payment of the purchase price for, the Bonds.

“Code” means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, the Regulations (whether temporary or final) under that Code or the statutory predecessor of that Code, and any amendments of, or successor provisions to, the foregoing and any official rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and judicial determinations regarding any of the foregoing, all as and to the extent applicable. Unless otherwise indicated, reference to a Section of the Code includes any applicable successor section or provision and such applicable Regulations, rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and determinations pertinent to that Section.

“Fiscal Officer” means the Finance Director of the City.

“Interest Payment Dates” means, unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, June 1 and December 1 of each year that the Bonds are outstanding, commencing June 1, 2019.

“Mayor” means the Mayor of the City.

“Original Purchaser” means the original purchaser of the Bonds designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award.

“Principal Payment Dates” means unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, December 1 in the years from and including 2019 to and including 2023, provided that in no case shall the final Principal Payment Date be later than the maximum maturity of the Bonds referred to in the preambles hereto.

Section 2. Authorized Principal Amount and Purpose; Application of Proceeds. This Council determines that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City to issue bonds of the City as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$265,000 (the Bonds) for the purpose of paying a portion of the costs of improving South Clinton Street by widening, reconstructing, grading, draining, paving and resurfacing, together with the necessary related improvements and appurtenances thereto, including the payment of expenses related to the issuance of the Bonds.

Subject to the limitations set forth in this Ordinance, the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued, the principal maturities of and the principal payment schedule for the Bonds, the interest rate or rates that the Bonds shall bear and certain other terms and provisions of the Bonds identified in this Ordinance are subject to further specification or determination in the Certificate of Award upon the finalization of the terms and provisions of the Bonds. The aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be issued, as so specified by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, shall be the aggregate principal amount of Bonds required to be issued, taking into account any premium above or discount from the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds at which they are sold to the Original Purchaser, in order to effect the purpose for which the Bonds are to be issued, including the payment of any expenses properly allocable to the issuance of the Bonds.

The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds received by the City shall be paid into the proper fund or funds, and those proceeds are appropriated and shall be used for the purpose for which the Bonds are being issued. Any portion of those proceeds received by the City representing premium (after payment of financing costs) or accrued interest shall be paid into the Bond Retirement Fund.

Section 3. Denominations; Dating; Principal and Interest Payment and Prepayment Provisions. The Bonds shall be issued as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$265,000. The Bonds shall be dated as provided in the Certificate of Award, provided that their dated date shall not be more than 60 days prior to the Closing Date.

(a) Interest Rates and Interest Payment Dates. The Bonds shall bear interest at the rate or rates per year (computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of 12 30-day months) as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable at such rate or rates on the Interest Payment Dates until the principal amount has been paid or provided for. The Bonds shall bear interest from the most recent date to which interest has been paid or provided for or, if no interest has been paid or provided for, from their date.

(b) Principal Payment Schedule. The Bonds shall mature on the Principal Payment Dates in principal amounts as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer, subject to subsection (c) of this Section, in the Certificate of Award, consistent with the Fiscal Officer’s determination of the best interest of and financial advantages to the City.

(c) Conditions for Establishment of Interest Rates and Principal Payment Dates and Amounts. The rate or rates of interest per year to be borne by the Bonds, and the principal amount of Bonds maturing on each Principal Payment Date, shall be such that (i) the total principal and interest payments on the Bonds in any fiscal year in which principal is payable is not more than three times the amount of those payments in any other such fiscal year and (ii) the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%.

(d) Payment of Debt Charges. The debt charges on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for the services of the Bond Registrar as paying agent. Principal of the Bonds shall be payable when due upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar. Interest on a Bond shall be paid on each Interest Payment Date by check or draft mailed to the person in whose name the Bond was registered, and to that person's address appearing, on the Bond Register at the close of business on the 15th day preceding that Interest Payment Date. Notwithstanding the foregoing, so long as the Original Purchaser is the registered owner of the Bonds, (i) the principal installments on the Bonds may be paid on each Principal Payment Date and any prepayment date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner, provided that in connection with the payment or prepayment of the final installment of principal of the Bonds, the registered owner thereof shall present and surrender its Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar, and (ii) interest on the Bonds may be paid on each Interest Payment Date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner.

(e) Prepayment. If agreed to by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds shall be prepayable, in whole or in part, with or without penalty or premium, at the option of the City at any time or a specific time prior to maturity, each as designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award and as provided in this Ordinance. Prepayment prior to maturity shall be made by deposit with the Bond Registrar of the principal amount of the Bonds then to be prepaid, together with interest accrued thereon to the date of prepayment. The City's right of prepayment shall be exercised by mailing a notice of prepayment, stating the date of prepayment and the name and address of the Bond Registrar, by certified or registered mail to the registered owners of the Bonds to be prepaid, and at their addresses, each as shown on the Bond Register at the close of business on the day preceding the mailing of the notice. The notice shall be mailed not less than 30 days prior to the date of that deposit, unless that notice is waived by the registered owner(s) of the Bonds. If moneys for prepayment are on deposit with the Bond Registrar on the specified prepayment date following the giving of that notice (unless the requirement of that notice is waived as stated above), interest on the principal amount prepaid shall cease to accrue on the prepayment date, and upon the request of the Fiscal Officer the registered owner(s) of the Bonds shall arrange for the delivery of the Bonds to the Bond Registrar for prepayment and surrender and cancellation.

Section 4. Execution and Authentication of Bonds. The Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer, in the name of the City and in their official capacities, provided that either or both of those signatures may be a facsimile. The Bonds shall be issued in the Authorized Denominations and numbers as requested by the Original Purchaser and approved by the Fiscal Officer, shall be numbered as determined by the Fiscal Officer in order to distinguish each Bond from any other Bond, and shall express upon their faces the purpose, in summary terms, for which they are issued and that they are issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 133 of the Revised Code, this Ordinance and the Certificate of Award; provided, however, that, if requested by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds may be issued as a single registered Bond with multiple maturities of principal in Authorized Denominations as set forth in a payment schedule to be set forth in such Bond or attached thereto.

No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any security or benefit under the Bond proceedings unless and until the certificate of authentication printed on the Bond is signed by the Bond Registrar as authenticating agent. Authentication by the Bond Registrar shall be conclusive evidence that the Bond so authenticated has been duly issued, signed and delivered under, and is entitled to the security and benefit of, the Bond proceedings. The certificate of authentication may be signed by any authorized officer or employee of the Bond Registrar or by any other person acting as an agent of the Bond Registrar and approved by the Fiscal Officer on behalf of the City. The same person need not sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Bonds.

Section 5. Registration; Transfer and Exchange.

(a) Bond Registrar. So long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding, the City will cause the Bond Registrar to maintain and keep the Bond Register at the office satisfactory to the Fiscal Officer and the Bond Registrar. The person in whose name a Bond is registered on the Bond Register shall be regarded as the absolute owner of that Bond for all purposes of the Bond proceedings. Payment of or on account of the debt charges on any Bond shall be made only to or upon the order of that person; neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be affected by any notice to the contrary, but the registration may be changed as provided in this Section. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the City's liability upon the Bond, including interest, to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

(b) Transfer and Exchange. Any Bond may be exchanged for Bonds of any Authorized Denomination upon presentation and surrender at the office of the Bond Registrar, together with a request for exchange signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. A Bond may be transferred only on the Bond Register upon presentation and surrender of the Bond at the office of the Bond Registrar together with an assignment signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. Upon exchange or transfer the Bond Registrar shall complete, authenticate and deliver a new Bond or Bonds of any Authorized Denomination or Denominations requested by the owner equal in the aggregate to the unmaturing principal amount of the Bond surrendered and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date.

If manual signatures on behalf of the City are required, the Bond Registrar shall undertake the exchange or transfer of Bonds only after the new Bonds are signed by the authorized officers of the City. In all cases of Bonds exchanged or transferred, the City shall sign and the Bond Registrar shall authenticate and deliver Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Bond proceedings. The exchange or transfer shall be without charge to the owner, except that the City and Bond Registrar may make a charge sufficient to reimburse them for any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the exchange or transfer. The City or the Bond Registrar may require that those charges, if any, be paid before the procedure is begun for the exchange or transfer. All Bonds issued and authenticated upon any exchange or transfer shall be valid obligations of the City, evidencing the same debt, and entitled to the same security and benefit under the Bond proceedings as the Bonds surrendered upon that exchange or transfer. Neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be required to make any exchange or transfer of (i) Bonds then subject to call for prepayment between the 15th day preceding the mailing of notice of Bonds to be prepaid and the date of that mailing, or (ii) any Bond selected for prepayment, in whole or in part.

Section 6. Sale of the Bonds.

(a) Original Purchaser Designated in Certificate of Award. The Bonds shall be sold to the Original Purchaser at a purchase price, not less than 97% of their aggregate principal amount, to be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, plus accrued interest on the Bonds from their date to the Closing Date, and shall be awarded by the Fiscal Officer with and upon such other terms as are required or authorized by this Ordinance to be specified in the Certificate of Award, in accordance with law and the provisions of this Ordinance. The Fiscal Officer is authorized, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the City, to combine the issue of Bonds with one or more other bond issues of the City into a consolidated bond issue pursuant to Section 133.30(B) of the Revised Code in which case a single Certificate of Award may be utilized for the consolidated bond issue if appropriate and consistent with the terms of this Ordinance.

The Fiscal Officer shall sign and deliver the Certificate of Award and shall cause the Bonds to be prepared and signed and delivered, together with a true transcript of proceedings with reference to the issuance of the Bonds, to the Original Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price. The Mayor, the Fiscal Officer, the Law Director, the Clerk of Council and other City officials, as appropriate, each are authorized and directed to sign any transcript certificates, financial statements and other documents and instruments and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance.

(b) Financing Costs. The expenditure of the amounts necessary to pay the financing costs (as defined in Section 133.01 of the Revised Code) in connection with the Bonds is authorized and approved, and the Fiscal Officer is authorized to provide for the payment of any such amounts and costs from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise from any other funds lawfully available that are appropriated or shall be appropriated for that purpose.

Section 7. Provisions for Tax Levy. There shall be levied on all the taxable property in the City, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period the Bonds are outstanding in an amount sufficient to pay the debt charges on the Bonds when due, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by Section 11 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution. The tax shall be within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law, shall be and is ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of those years are certified, levied, extended and collected, and shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The proceeds of the tax levy shall be placed in the Bond Retirement Fund, which is irrevocably pledged for the payment of the debt charges on the Bonds when and as the same fall due. In each year, to the extent other funds are available for the payment of debt charges on the Bonds and are appropriated for that purpose, the amount of the tax shall be reduced by the amount of other funds so available and appropriated.

Section 8. Federal Tax Considerations. The City covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Bonds in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Bonds will not (i) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Section 141, 148 or 149 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code), or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103 of the Code applies, and (b) the interest thereon will not be an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code.

The City further covenants that (a) it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of them for the interest on the Bonds to be and to remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (b) it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion and (c) it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the governmental purposes of the borrowing, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii) make timely and adequate payments to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The Fiscal Officer, or any other officer of the City having responsibility for the issuance of the Bonds is hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation (including designation or treatment of the Bonds as “qualified tax-exempt obligations” if such designation or treatment is applicable and desirable, and to make any related necessary representations and covenants), choice, consent, approval or waiver on behalf of the City with respect to the Bonds as the City is permitted or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections provided for in or available under Section 148 of the Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting the favorable tax treatment or status of the Bonds or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments or penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and signed by the officer, (b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the City, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Bonds, and (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the City, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the City regarding the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Bonds, the facts, circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Bonds.

Each covenant made in this section with respect to the Bonds is also made with respect to all issues any portion of the debt service on which is paid from proceeds of the Bonds (and, if different, the original issue and any refunding issues in a series of refundings), to the extent such

compliance is necessary to assure exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and the officers identified above are authorized to take actions with respect to those issues as they are authorized in this section to take with respect to the Bonds.

Section 9. Certification and Delivery of Ordinance and Certificate of Award. The Clerk of Council is directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Ordinance and a signed copy of the Certificate of Award to the Defiance County Auditor.

Section 10. Satisfaction of Conditions for Bond Issuance. This Council determines that all acts and conditions necessary to be performed by the City or to have been met precedent to and in the issuing of the Bonds in order to make them legal, valid and binding general obligations of the City have been performed and have been met, or will at the time of delivery of the Bonds have been performed and have been met, in regular and due form as required by law; that the full faith and credit and general property taxing power (as described in Section 7) of the City are pledged for the timely payment of the debt charges on the Bonds; and that no statutory or constitutional limitation of indebtedness or taxation will have been exceeded in the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 11. Retention of Bond Counsel. The legal services of Squire Patton Boggs (US) LLP, as bond counsel, be and are hereby retained. The legal services shall be in the nature of legal advice and recommendations as to the documents and the proceedings in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the rendering of the necessary legal opinion upon the delivery of the Bonds. In rendering those legal services, as an independent contractor and in an attorney-client relationship, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those legal services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those legal services. The Fiscal Officer is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 12. Retention of Municipal Advisor. The services of Sudsina & Associates, LLC, as municipal advisor, be and are hereby retained. The municipal advisory services shall be in the nature of financial advice and recommendations in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. In rendering those municipal advisory services, as an independent contractor, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those municipal advisory services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those municipal advisory services. The Finance Director is authorized to provide for the payment of those fees and any reimbursements from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 13. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the enactment of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law.

Section 14. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings in this Ordinance are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof. Reference to a Section means a section of this Ordinance unless otherwise indicated.

Section 15. Declaration of Emergency; Effective Date. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to sell the Notes at the earliest possible date, which is necessary to enable the City

to retire the Outstanding Notes and thereby preserve its credit; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 8049

This is a summary of Ordinance No. 8049, enacted by the Council of the City of Defiance on August 14, 2018, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$265,000 for the purpose of paying a portion of the costs of improving South Clinton Street by widening, reconstructing, grading, draining, paving and resurfacing, together with the necessary related improvements and appurtenances thereto.

The bonds are to be dated their date of issuance and to bear interest at a rate or rates such that the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%, and to mature in not more than 20 annual installments. The ordinance provides for sale of the bonds to the original purchaser designated by the Finance Director in a certificate of award, and authorizes the Finance Director to determine the principal amount of and interest rate or rates (subject to the above) on the bonds and their redemption features, if any. The ordinance provides for the manner of payment of the bonds, their form and signing and the application of the proceeds, and provides assurances of the City relating to the federal income tax status of the interest on the bonds. The ordinance also provides for the levy of a tax within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law on all the taxable property in the City while the bonds are outstanding, and that the bonds will be general obligations of the City, the full faith and credit and general property taxing power of which are pledged for the payment of principal and interest.

The complete text of the ordinance may be obtained or viewed at the office of the Clerk of Council. The ordinance was declared to be an emergency measure.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$925,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING COSTS OF IMPROVING THE CITY'S PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES BY CONSTRUCTING A SPLASH PAD AT THE CITY'S BRONSON PARK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 7941, enacted on August 8, 2017, there were issued \$500,000 of notes (the Outstanding Notes) in anticipation of bonds for the purpose stated in Section 2 as part of a consolidated issue of \$2,330,000 Various Purpose Notes, Series 2017, which Outstanding Notes mature on September 20, 2018; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines that the City should retire the Outstanding Notes with the proceeds of the Bonds described in Section 2 and provide an additional not to exceed \$400,000 for the purpose stated in Section 2; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director, as fiscal officer of the City, has certified to this Council that the estimated life or period of usefulness of the improvement described in Section 2 is at least five years and the estimated maximum maturity of the Bonds described in Section 2 is 20 years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, that:

Section 1. Definitions. In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Ordinance, unless the context or use clearly indicates another or different meaning or intent:

“Authorized Denominations” means the denomination of \$100,000 or any whole multiple of \$1,000 in excess thereof.

“Bond proceedings” means, collectively, this Ordinance, the Certificate of Award and such other proceedings of the City, including the Bonds, that provide collectively for, among other things, the rights of holders and beneficial owners of the Bonds.

“Bond Register” means all books and records necessary for the registration, exchange and transfer of Bonds as provided in Section 5.

“Bond Registrar” means the Fiscal Officer.

“Certificate of Award” means the certificate authorized by Section 6(a), to be signed by the Fiscal Officer, setting forth and determining those terms or other matters pertaining to the Bonds and their issuance, sale and delivery as this Ordinance requires or authorizes to be set forth or determined therein.

“Closing Date” means the date of physical delivery of, and payment of the purchase price for, the Bonds.

“Code” means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, the Regulations (whether temporary or final) under that Code or the statutory predecessor of that Code, and any amendments of, or successor provisions to, the foregoing and any official rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and judicial determinations regarding any of the foregoing, all as and to the extent applicable. Unless otherwise indicated, reference to a Section of the Code includes any applicable successor section or provision and such applicable Regulations, rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and determinations pertinent to that Section.

“Fiscal Officer” means the Finance Director of the City.

“Interest Payment Dates” means, unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, June 1 and December 1 of each year that the Bonds are outstanding, commencing June 1, 2019.

“Mayor” means the Mayor of the City.

“Original Purchaser” means the original purchaser of the Bonds designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award.

“Principal Payment Dates” means unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, December 1 in the years from and including 2019 to and including 2023, provided that in no case shall the final Principal Payment Date be later than the maximum maturity of the Bonds referred to in the preambles hereto.

Section 2. Authorized Principal Amount and Purpose; Application of Proceeds. This Council determines that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City to issue bonds of the City as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$925,000 (the Bonds) for the purpose of paying costs of improving the City’s parks and recreational facilities by constructing a splash pad at the City’s Bronson Park, together with the necessary appurtenances thereto, including the payment of expenses related to the issuance of the Bonds.

Subject to the limitations set forth in this Ordinance, the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued, the principal maturities of and the principal payment schedule for the Bonds, the interest rate or rates that the Bonds shall bear and certain other terms and provisions of the Bonds identified in this Ordinance are subject to further specification or determination in the Certificate of Award upon the finalization of the terms and provisions of the Bonds. The aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be issued, as so specified by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, shall be the aggregate principal amount of Bonds required to be issued, taking into account any premium above or discount from the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds at which they are sold to the Original Purchaser, in order to effect the purpose for which the Bonds are to be issued, including the payment of any expenses properly allocable to the issuance of the Bonds.

The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds received by the City shall be paid into the proper fund or funds, and those proceeds are appropriated and shall be used for the purpose for which the Bonds are being issued. Any portion of those proceeds received by the City representing premium (after payment of financing costs) or accrued interest shall be paid into the Bond Retirement Fund.

Section 3. Denominations; Dating; Principal and Interest Payment and Prepayment Provisions. The Bonds shall be issued as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$925,000. The Bonds shall be dated as provided in the Certificate of Award, provided that their dated date shall not be more than 60 days prior to the Closing Date.

(a) Interest Rates and Interest Payment Dates. The Bonds shall bear interest at the rate or rates per year (computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of 12 30-day months) as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable at such rate or rates on the Interest Payment Dates until the principal amount has been paid or provided for. The Bonds shall bear interest from the most recent date to which interest has been paid or provided for or, if no interest has been paid or provided for, from their date.

(b) Principal Payment Schedule. The Bonds shall mature on the Principal Payment Dates in principal amounts as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer, subject to subsection (c) of this Section, in the Certificate of Award, consistent with the Fiscal Officer’s determination of the best interest of and financial advantages to the City.

(c) Conditions for Establishment of Interest Rates and Principal Payment Dates and Amounts. The rate or rates of interest per year to be borne by the Bonds, and the principal amount of Bonds maturing on each Principal Payment Date, shall be such that (i) the total principal and interest payments on the Bonds in any fiscal year in which principal is payable is not more than three times the amount of those payments in any other such fiscal year and (ii) the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%.

(d) Payment of Debt Charges. The debt charges on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for the services of the Bond Registrar as paying agent. Principal of the Bonds shall be payable when due upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar. Interest on a Bond shall be paid on each Interest Payment Date by check or draft mailed to the person in whose name the Bond was registered, and to that person's address appearing, on the Bond Register at the close of business on the 15th day preceding that Interest Payment Date. Notwithstanding the foregoing, so long as the Original Purchaser is the registered owner of the Bonds, (i) the principal installments on the Bonds may be paid on each Principal Payment Date and any prepayment date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner, provided that in connection with the payment or prepayment of the final installment of principal of the Bonds, the registered owner thereof shall present and surrender its Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar, and (ii) interest on the Bonds may be paid on each Interest Payment Date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner.

(e) Prepayment. If agreed to by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds shall be prepayable, in whole or in part, with or without penalty or premium, at the option of the City at any time or a specific time prior to maturity, each as designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award and as provided in this Ordinance. Prepayment prior to maturity shall be made by deposit with the Bond Registrar of the principal amount of the Bonds then to be prepaid, together with interest accrued thereon to the date of prepayment. The City's right of prepayment shall be exercised by mailing a notice of prepayment, stating the date of prepayment and the name and address of the Bond Registrar, by certified or registered mail to the registered owners of the Bonds to be prepaid, and at their addresses, each as shown on the Bond Register at the close of business on the day preceding the mailing of the notice. The notice shall be mailed not less than 30 days prior to the date of that deposit, unless that notice is waived by the registered owner(s) of the Bonds. If moneys for prepayment are on deposit with the Bond Registrar on the specified prepayment date following the giving of that notice (unless the requirement of that notice is waived as stated above), interest on the principal amount prepaid shall cease to accrue on the prepayment date, and upon the request of the Fiscal Officer the registered owner(s) of the Bonds shall arrange for the delivery of the Bonds to the Bond Registrar for prepayment and surrender and cancellation.

Section 4. Execution and Authentication of Bonds. The Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer, in the name of the City and in their official capacities, provided that either or both of those signatures may be a facsimile. The Bonds shall be issued in the Authorized Denominations and numbers as requested by the Original Purchaser and approved by the Fiscal Officer, shall be numbered as determined by the Fiscal Officer in order to distinguish each Bond from any other Bond, and shall express upon their faces the purpose, in summary terms, for which they are issued and that they are issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 133 of the Revised Code, this Ordinance and the Certificate of Award; provided, however, that, if requested by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds may be issued as a single registered Bond with multiple maturities of principal in Authorized Denominations as set forth in a payment schedule to be set forth in such Bond or attached thereto.

No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any security or benefit under the Bond proceedings unless and until the certificate of authentication printed on the Bond is signed by the Bond Registrar as authenticating agent. Authentication by the Bond Registrar shall be conclusive evidence that the Bond so authenticated has been duly issued, signed and delivered under, and is entitled to the security and benefit of, the Bond proceedings. The certificate of authentication may be signed by any authorized officer or employee of the Bond Registrar or by any other person acting as an agent of the Bond Registrar and approved by the Fiscal Officer on behalf of the City. The same person need not sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Bonds.

Section 5. Registration; Transfer and Exchange.

(a) Bond Registrar. So long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding, the City will cause the Bond Registrar to maintain and keep the Bond Register at the office satisfactory to the

Fiscal Officer and the Bond Registrar. The person in whose name a Bond is registered on the Bond Register shall be regarded as the absolute owner of that Bond for all purposes of the Bond proceedings. Payment of or on account of the debt charges on any Bond shall be made only to or upon the order of that person; neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be affected by any notice to the contrary, but the registration may be changed as provided in this Section. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the City's liability upon the Bond, including interest, to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

(b) Transfer and Exchange. Any Bond may be exchanged for Bonds of any Authorized Denomination upon presentation and surrender at the office of the Bond Registrar, together with a request for exchange signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. A Bond may be transferred only on the Bond Register upon presentation and surrender of the Bond at the office of the Bond Registrar together with an assignment signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. Upon exchange or transfer the Bond Registrar shall complete, authenticate and deliver a new Bond or Bonds of any Authorized Denomination or Denominations requested by the owner equal in the aggregate to the unmatured principal amount of the Bond surrendered and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date.

If manual signatures on behalf of the City are required, the Bond Registrar shall undertake the exchange or transfer of Bonds only after the new Bonds are signed by the authorized officers of the City. In all cases of Bonds exchanged or transferred, the City shall sign and the Bond Registrar shall authenticate and deliver Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Bond proceedings. The exchange or transfer shall be without charge to the owner, except that the City and Bond Registrar may make a charge sufficient to reimburse them for any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the exchange or transfer. The City or the Bond Registrar may require that those charges, if any, be paid before the procedure is begun for the exchange or transfer. All Bonds issued and authenticated upon any exchange or transfer shall be valid obligations of the City, evidencing the same debt, and entitled to the same security and benefit under the Bond proceedings as the Bonds surrendered upon that exchange or transfer. Neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be required to make any exchange or transfer of (i) Bonds then subject to call for prepayment between the 15th day preceding the mailing of notice of Bonds to be prepaid and the date of that mailing, or (ii) any Bond selected for prepayment, in whole or in part.

Section 6. Sale of the Bonds.

(a) Original Purchaser Designated in Certificate of Award. The Bonds shall be sold to the Original Purchaser at a purchase price, not less than 97% of their aggregate principal amount, to be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, plus accrued interest on the Bonds from their date to the Closing Date, and shall be awarded by the Fiscal Officer with and upon such other terms as are required or authorized by this Ordinance to be specified in the Certificate of Award, in accordance with law and the provisions of this Ordinance. The Fiscal Officer is authorized, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the City, to combine the issue of Bonds with one or more other bond issues of the City into a consolidated bond issue pursuant to Section 133.30(B) of the Revised Code in which case a single Certificate of Award may be utilized for the consolidated bond issue if appropriate and consistent with the terms of this Ordinance.

The Fiscal Officer shall sign and deliver the Certificate of Award and shall cause the Bonds to be prepared and signed and delivered, together with a true transcript of proceedings with reference to the issuance of the Bonds, to the Original Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price. The Mayor, the Fiscal Officer, the Law Director, the Clerk of Council and other City officials, as appropriate, each are authorized and directed to sign any transcript certificates, financial statements and other documents and instruments and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance.

(b) Financing Costs. The expenditure of the amounts necessary to pay the financing costs (as defined in Section 133.01 of the Revised Code) in connection with the Bonds is authorized and approved, and the Fiscal Officer is authorized to provide for the payment of any such amounts and costs from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise

from any other funds lawfully available that are appropriated or shall be appropriated for that purpose.

Section 7. Provisions for Tax Levy. There shall be levied on all the taxable property in the City, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period the Bonds are outstanding in an amount sufficient to pay the debt charges on the Bonds when due, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by Section 11 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution. The tax shall be within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law, shall be and is ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of those years are certified, levied, extended and collected, and shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The proceeds of the tax levy shall be placed in the Bond Retirement Fund, which is irrevocably pledged for the payment of the debt charges on the Bonds when and as the same fall due. In each year, to the extent other funds are available for the payment of debt charges on the Bonds and are appropriated for that purpose, the amount of the tax shall be reduced by the amount of other funds so available and appropriated.

Section 8. Federal Tax Considerations. The City covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Bonds in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Bonds will not (i) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Section 141, 148 or 149 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code), or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103 of the Code applies, and (b) the interest thereon will not be an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code.

The City further covenants that (a) it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of them for the interest on the Bonds to be and to remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (b) it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion and (c) it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the governmental purposes of the borrowing, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii) make timely and adequate payments to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The Fiscal Officer, or any other officer of the City having responsibility for the issuance of the Bonds is hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation (including designation or treatment of the Bonds as “qualified tax-exempt obligations” if such designation or treatment is applicable and desirable, and to make any related necessary representations and covenants), choice, consent, approval or waiver on behalf of the City with respect to the Bonds as the City is permitted or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections provided for in or available under Section 148 of the Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting the favorable tax treatment or status of the Bonds or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments or penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and signed by the officer, (b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the City, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Bonds, and (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the City, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the City regarding the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Bonds, the facts, circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Bonds.

Each covenant made in this section with respect to the Bonds is also made with respect to all issues any portion of the debt service on which is paid from proceeds of the Bonds (and, if different, the original issue and any refunding issues in a series of refundings), to the extent such compliance is necessary to assure exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and the officers identified above are authorized to take actions with respect to those issues as they are authorized in this section to take with respect to the Bonds.

Section 9. Certification and Delivery of Ordinance and Certificate of Award. The Clerk of Council is directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Ordinance and a signed copy of the Certificate of Award to the Defiance County Auditor.

Section 10. Satisfaction of Conditions for Bond Issuance. This Council determines that all acts and conditions necessary to be performed by the City or to have been met precedent to and in the issuing of the Bonds in order to make them legal, valid and binding general obligations of the City have been performed and have been met, or will at the time of delivery of the Bonds have been performed and have been met, in regular and due form as required by law; that the full faith and credit and general property taxing power (as described in Section 7) of the City are pledged for the timely payment of the debt charges on the Bonds; and that no statutory or constitutional limitation of indebtedness or taxation will have been exceeded in the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 11. Retention of Bond Counsel. The legal services of Squire Patton Boggs (US) LLP, as bond counsel, be and are hereby retained. The legal services shall be in the nature of legal advice and recommendations as to the documents and the proceedings in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the rendering of the necessary legal opinion upon the delivery of the Bonds. In rendering those legal services, as an independent contractor and in an attorney-client relationship, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those legal services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those legal services. The Fiscal Officer is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 12. Retention of Municipal Advisor. The services of Sudsina & Associates, LLC, as municipal advisor, be and are hereby retained. The municipal advisory services shall be in the nature of financial advice and recommendations in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. In rendering those municipal advisory services, as an independent contractor, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those municipal advisory services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those municipal advisory services. The Finance Director is authorized to provide for the payment of those fees and any reimbursements from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 13. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the enactment of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law.

Section 14. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings in this Ordinance are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof. Reference to a Section means a section of this Ordinance unless otherwise indicated.

Section 15. Declaration of Emergency; Effective Date. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to sell the Notes at the earliest possible date, which is necessary to (i) enable the City to retire the Outstanding Notes and thereby preserve its credit and (ii) enter into contracts for the improvement, which is needed to promote the health of the residents of the City by enhancing their recreational opportunities; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

FISCAL OFFICER'S CERTIFICATE

To the Council of the City of Defiance, Ohio:

As fiscal officer of the City of Defiance, Ohio, I certify in connection with your proposed issue of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$925,000 (the Bonds) for the purpose of paying costs of improving the City's parks and recreational facilities by constructing a splash pad at the City's Bronson Park, together with the necessary appurtenances thereto (the improvement), that:

1. The estimated life or period of usefulness of the improvement is at least five years.
2. The estimated maximum maturity of the Bonds, calculated in accordance with Section 133.20 of the Revised Code, is at least 20 years, being my estimate of the life or period of usefulness of those improvements; if and to the extent a portion of the proceeds of the Bonds is to be allocated to a class or classes having a maximum maturity of less than 20 years but in excess of five years, then the maximum maturity of the Bonds would still be at least 20 years by reason of a sufficient portion of the proceeds of the Bonds allocated to a class or classes having a maximum maturity or an estimated period of usefulness in excess of 20 years.

Ordinance No. 8050

This is a summary of Ordinance No. 8050, enacted by the Council of the City of Defiance on August 14, 2018, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$925,000 for the purpose of paying costs of improving the City's parks and recreational facilities by constructing a splash pad at the City's Bronson Park, together with the necessary appurtenances thereto.

The bonds are to be dated their date of issuance and to bear interest at a rate or rates such that the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%, and to mature in not more than 20 annual installments. The ordinance provides for sale of the bonds to the original purchaser designated by the Finance Director in a certificate of award, and authorizes the Finance Director to determine the principal amount of and interest rate or rates (subject to the above) on the bonds and their redemption features, if any. The ordinance provides for the manner of payment of the bonds, their form and signing and the application of the proceeds, and provides assurances of the City relating to the federal income tax status of the interest on the bonds. The ordinance also provides for the levy of a tax within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law on all the taxable property in the City while the bonds are outstanding, and that the bonds will be general obligations of the City, the full faith and credit and general property taxing power of which are pledged for the payment of principal and interest.

The complete text of the ordinance may be obtained or viewed at the office of the Clerk of Council. The ordinance was declared to be an emergency measure.

ORDINANCE NO. 8051

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$3,175,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING COSTS OF IMPROVING AND EXPANDING THE MUNICIPAL SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM BY CONSTRUCTING AND IMPROVING PUMP STATIONS, FORCE MAINS AND SANITARY SEWERS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 7188, enacted on September 7, 2010, there were issued \$1,500,000 of notes in anticipation of bonds for the purpose stated in Section 2 as part of a consolidated issue of \$6,150,000 Various Purpose Notes, Series 2010-2, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$1,425,000 Sanitary Sewerage System Improvement Notes, Series 2011, issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7300, enacted on September 6, 2011, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$1,350,000 Sanitary Sewerage System Improvement Notes, Series 2012-2, issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7246, enacted on September 11, 2012, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$1,275,000 Sanitary Sewerage System Improvement Notes, Series 2013-2, issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7530, enacted on August 27, 2013, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$1,210,000 Sanitary Sewerage System Improvement Notes, Series 2014-2, issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7655, enacted on August 26, 2014, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$1,145,000 Sanitary Sewerage System Improvement Notes, Series 2015-2, issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7743, enacted on August 25, 2015, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, and an additional \$500,000 for the purpose stated in Section 2 was provided, with the proceeds of \$1,505,000 of notes issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7846, enacted on August 23, 2016, as part of a consolidated issue of \$2,205,000 Various Purpose Notes, Series 2016, which notes were retired at maturity, together with other funds available to the City, with the proceeds of \$1,305,000 of notes (the Outstanding Notes) issued in anticipation of bonds pursuant to Ordinance No. 7942, enacted on August 8, 2017, as part of a consolidated issue of \$2,330,000 Various Purpose Notes, Series 2017, which Outstanding Notes mature on September 20, 2018; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines that the City should retire the Outstanding Notes with the proceeds of the Bonds described in Section 2 and other funds available to the City and provide an additional not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the purpose stated in Section 2; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director, as fiscal officer of the City, has certified to this Council that the estimated life or period of usefulness of the improvement described in Section 2 is at least five years and the estimated maximum maturity of the Bonds described in Section 2 is at least 26 years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, that:

Section 1. Definitions. In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Ordinance, unless the context or use clearly indicates another or different meaning or intent:

“Authorized Denominations” means the denomination of \$100,000 or any whole multiple of \$1,000 in excess thereof.

“Bond proceedings” means, collectively, this Ordinance, the Certificate of Award and such other proceedings of the City, including the Bonds, that provide collectively for, among other things, the rights of holders and beneficial owners of the Bonds.

“Bond Register” means all books and records necessary for the registration, exchange and transfer of Bonds as provided in Section 5.

“Bond Registrar” means the Fiscal Officer.

“Certificate of Award” means the certificate authorized by Section 6(a), to be signed by the Fiscal Officer, setting forth and determining those terms or other matters pertaining to the Bonds and their issuance, sale and delivery as this Ordinance requires or authorizes to be set forth or determined therein.

“Closing Date” means the date of physical delivery of, and payment of the purchase price for, the Bonds.

“Code” means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, the Regulations (whether temporary or final) under that Code or the statutory predecessor of that Code, and any amendments of, or successor provisions to, the foregoing and any official rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and judicial determinations regarding any of the foregoing, all as and to the extent applicable. Unless otherwise indicated, reference to a Section of the Code includes any applicable successor section or provision and such applicable Regulations, rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and determinations pertinent to that Section.

“Fiscal Officer” means the Finance Director of the City.

“Interest Payment Dates” means, unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, June 1 and December 1 of each year that the Bonds are outstanding, commencing June 1, 2019.

“Mayor” means the Mayor of the City.

“Original Purchaser” means the original purchaser of the Bonds designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award.

“Principal Payment Dates” means unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, December 1 in the years from and including 2019 to and including 2028, provided that in no case shall the final Principal Payment Date be later than the maximum maturity of the Bonds referred to in the preambles hereto.

Section 2. Authorized Principal Amount and Purpose; Application of Proceeds. This Council determines that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City to issue bonds of the City as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$3,175,000 (the Bonds) for the purpose of paying costs of improving and expanding the municipal sanitary sewerage system by constructing and improving pump stations, force mains and sanitary sewers, together with all incidental work and related appurtenances thereto and acquiring any real estate or interests therein required therefor, including the payment of expenses related to the issuance of the Bonds.

Subject to the limitations set forth in this Ordinance, the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued, the principal maturities of and the principal payment schedule for the Bonds, the interest rate or rates that the Bonds shall bear and certain other terms and provisions of the Bonds identified in this Ordinance are subject to further specification or determination in the Certificate of Award upon the finalization of the terms and provisions of the Bonds. The aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be issued, as so specified by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, shall be the aggregate principal amount of Bonds required to be issued, taking into account any premium above or discount from the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds at which they are sold to the Original Purchaser, in order to effect the purpose for which the Bonds are to be issued, including the payment of any expenses properly allocable to the issuance of the Bonds.

The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds received by the City shall be paid into the proper fund or funds, and those proceeds are appropriated and shall be used for the purpose for which the Bonds are being issued. Any portion of those proceeds received by the City representing premium (after payment of financing costs) or accrued interest shall be paid into the Bond Retirement Fund.

Section 3. Denominations; Dating; Principal and Interest Payment and Prepayment Provisions. The Bonds shall be issued as a single fully registered bond in one lot in the maximum principal amount of \$3,175,000. The Bonds shall be dated as provided in the Certificate of Award, provided that their dated date shall not be more than 60 days prior to the Closing Date.

(a) Interest Rates and Interest Payment Dates. The Bonds shall bear interest at the rate or rates per year (computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of 12 30-day months) as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable at such rate or rates on the Interest Payment Dates until the principal amount has been paid or provided for. The Bonds shall bear interest from the most recent date to which interest has been paid or provided for or, if no interest has been paid or provided for, from their date.

(b) Principal Payment Schedule. The Bonds shall mature on the Principal Payment Dates in principal amounts as shall be determined by the Fiscal Officer, subject to subsection (c) of this Section, in the Certificate of Award, consistent with the Fiscal Officer's determination of the best interest of and financial advantages to the City.

(c) Conditions for Establishment of Interest Rates and Principal Payment Dates and Amounts. The rate or rates of interest per year to be borne by the Bonds, and the principal amount of Bonds maturing on each Principal Payment Date, shall be such that (i) the total principal and interest payments on the Bonds in any fiscal year in which principal is payable is not more than three times the amount of those payments in any other such fiscal year and (ii) the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%.

(d) Payment of Debt Charges. The debt charges on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for the services of the Bond Registrar as paying agent. Principal of the Bonds shall be payable when due upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar. Interest on a Bond shall be paid on each Interest Payment Date by check or draft mailed to the person in whose name the Bond was registered, and to that person's address appearing, on the Bond Register at the close of business on the 15th day preceding that Interest Payment Date. Notwithstanding the foregoing, so long as the Original Purchaser is the registered owner of the Bonds, (i) the principal installments on the Bonds may be paid on each Principal Payment Date and any prepayment date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner, provided that in connection with the payment or prepayment of the final installment of principal of the Bonds, the registered owner thereof shall present and surrender its Bonds at the office of the Bond Registrar, and (ii) interest on the Bonds may be paid on each Interest Payment Date by (A) wire transfer of immediately available funds to the registered owner, without presentation or surrender thereof, to an account in the United States as such owner will direct in writing to the Bond Registrar or (B) check or draft mailed to the registered owner.

(e) Prepayment. If agreed to by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds shall be prepayable, in whole or in part, with or without penalty or premium, at the option of the City at any time or a specific time prior to maturity, each as designated by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award and as provided in this Ordinance. Prepayment prior to maturity shall be made by deposit with the Bond Registrar of the principal amount of the Bonds then to be prepaid, together with interest accrued thereon to the date of prepayment. The City's right of prepayment shall be exercised by mailing a notice of prepayment, stating the date of prepayment and the name and address of the Bond Registrar, by certified or registered mail to the registered owners of the Bonds to be prepaid, and at their addresses, each as shown on the Bond Register at the close of business on the day preceding the mailing of the notice. The notice shall be mailed not less than 30 days prior to the date of that deposit, unless that notice is waived by the registered owner(s) of the Bonds. If moneys for prepayment are on deposit with the Bond Registrar on the specified prepayment date following the giving of that notice (unless the requirement of that notice is waived as stated above), interest on the principal amount prepaid shall cease to accrue on the prepayment date, and upon the request of the Fiscal Officer the registered owner(s) of the Bonds shall arrange for the delivery of the Bonds to the Bond Registrar for prepayment and surrender and cancellation.

Section 4. Execution and Authentication of Bonds. The Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer, in the name of the City and in their official capacities, provided that either or both of those signatures may be a facsimile. The Bonds shall be issued in the Authorized Denominations and numbers as requested by the Original Purchaser and approved by the Fiscal Officer, shall be numbered as determined by the Fiscal Officer in order to distinguish each Bond from any other Bond, and shall express upon their faces the purpose, in summary terms, for which they are issued and that they are issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter

133 of the Revised Code, this Ordinance and the Certificate of Award; provided, however, that, if requested by the Original Purchaser, the Bonds may be issued as a single registered Bond with multiple maturities of principal in Authorized Denominations as set forth in a payment schedule to be set forth in such Bond or attached thereto.

No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any security or benefit under the Bond proceedings unless and until the certificate of authentication printed on the Bond is signed by the Bond Registrar as authenticating agent. Authentication by the Bond Registrar shall be conclusive evidence that the Bond so authenticated has been duly issued, signed and delivered under, and is entitled to the security and benefit of, the Bond proceedings. The certificate of authentication may be signed by any authorized officer or employee of the Bond Registrar or by any other person acting as an agent of the Bond Registrar and approved by the Fiscal Officer on behalf of the City. The same person need not sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Bonds.

Section 5. Registration; Transfer and Exchange.

(a) Bond Registrar. So long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding, the City will cause the Bond Registrar to maintain and keep the Bond Register at the office satisfactory to the Fiscal Officer and the Bond Registrar. The person in whose name a Bond is registered on the Bond Register shall be regarded as the absolute owner of that Bond for all purposes of the Bond proceedings. Payment of or on account of the debt charges on any Bond shall be made only to or upon the order of that person; neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be affected by any notice to the contrary, but the registration may be changed as provided in this Section. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the City's liability upon the Bond, including interest, to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

(b) Transfer and Exchange. Any Bond may be exchanged for Bonds of any Authorized Denomination upon presentation and surrender at the office of the Bond Registrar, together with a request for exchange signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. A Bond may be transferred only on the Bond Register upon presentation and surrender of the Bond at the office of the Bond Registrar together with an assignment signed by the registered owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar. Upon exchange or transfer the Bond Registrar shall complete, authenticate and deliver a new Bond or Bonds of any Authorized Denomination or Denominations requested by the owner equal in the aggregate to the unmatured principal amount of the Bond surrendered and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date.

If manual signatures on behalf of the City are required, the Bond Registrar shall undertake the exchange or transfer of Bonds only after the new Bonds are signed by the authorized officers of the City. In all cases of Bonds exchanged or transferred, the City shall sign and the Bond Registrar shall authenticate and deliver Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Bond proceedings. The exchange or transfer shall be without charge to the owner, except that the City and Bond Registrar may make a charge sufficient to reimburse them for any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the exchange or transfer. The City or the Bond Registrar may require that those charges, if any, be paid before the procedure is begun for the exchange or transfer. All Bonds issued and authenticated upon any exchange or transfer shall be valid obligations of the City, evidencing the same debt, and entitled to the same security and benefit under the Bond proceedings as the Bonds surrendered upon that exchange or transfer. Neither the City nor the Bond Registrar shall be required to make any exchange or transfer of (i) Bonds then subject to call for prepayment between the 15th day preceding the mailing of notice of Bonds to be prepaid and the date of that mailing, or (ii) any Bond selected for prepayment, in whole or in part.

Section 6. Sale of the Bonds.

(a) Original Purchaser Designated in Certificate of Award. The Bonds shall be sold to the Original Purchaser at a purchase price, not less than 97% of their aggregate principal amount, to be determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, plus accrued interest on the Bonds from their date to the Closing Date, and shall be awarded by the Fiscal Officer with and upon such other terms as are required or authorized by this Ordinance to be specified in the Certificate of Award, in accordance with law and the provisions of this Ordinance. The Fiscal Officer is authorized, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the City, to combine the issue

of Bonds with one or more other bond issues of the City into a consolidated bond issue pursuant to Section 133.30(B) of the Revised Code in which case a single Certificate of Award may be utilized for the consolidated bond issue if appropriate and consistent with the terms of this Ordinance.

The Fiscal Officer shall sign and deliver the Certificate of Award and shall cause the Bonds to be prepared and signed and delivered, together with a true transcript of proceedings with reference to the issuance of the Bonds, to the Original Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price. The Mayor, the Fiscal Officer, the Law Director of Law, the Clerk of Council and other City officials, as appropriate, each are authorized and directed to sign any transcript certificates, financial statements and other documents and instruments and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance.

(b) Financing Costs. The expenditure of the amounts necessary to pay the financing costs (as defined in Section 133.01 of the Revised Code) in connection with the Bonds is authorized and approved, and the Fiscal Officer is authorized to provide for the payment of any such amounts and costs from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise from any other funds lawfully available that are appropriated or shall be appropriated for that purpose.

Section 7. Provisions for Tax Levy. There shall be levied on all the taxable property in the City, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period the Bonds are outstanding in an amount sufficient to pay the debt charges on the Bonds when due, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by Section 11 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution. The tax shall be within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law, shall be and is ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of those years are certified, levied, extended and collected, and shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The proceeds of the tax levy shall be placed in the Bond Retirement Fund, which is irrevocably pledged for the payment of the debt charges on the Bonds when and as the same fall due. In each year to the extent money from the City's sanitary sewerage system or other sources is available for the payment of the debt charges on the Bonds, and is appropriated for that purpose, the tax shall be reduced by the amount of money so available and appropriated.

Section 8. Federal Tax Considerations. The City covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Bonds in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Bonds will not (i) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Section 141, 148 or 149 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code), or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103 of the Code applies, and (b) the interest thereon will not be an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code.

The City further covenants that (a) it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of them for the interest on the Bonds to be and to remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (b) it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion and (c) it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the governmental purposes of the borrowing, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii) make timely and adequate payments to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The Fiscal Officer, or any other officer of the City having responsibility for the issuance of the Bonds is hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation (including designation or treatment of the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" if such designation or treatment is applicable and desirable, and to make any related necessary representations and covenants), choice, consent, approval or waiver on behalf of the City with respect to the Bonds as the City is permitted or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections provided for in or available under Section 148 of the Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting the favorable tax treatment or status of the Bonds or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments or penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying,

excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and signed by the officer, (b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the City, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Bonds, and (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the City, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the City regarding the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Bonds, the facts, circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Bonds.

Each covenant made in this section with respect to the Bonds is also made with respect to all issues any portion of the debt service on which is paid from proceeds of the Bonds (and, if different, the original issue and any refunding issues in a series of refundings), to the extent such compliance is necessary to assure exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and the officers identified above are authorized to take actions with respect to those issues as they are authorized in this section to take with respect to the Bonds.

Section 9. Certification and Delivery of Ordinance and Certificate of Award. The Clerk of Council is directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Ordinance and a signed copy of the Certificate of Award to the Defiance County Auditor.

Section 10. Satisfaction of Conditions for Bond Issuance. This Council determines that all acts and conditions necessary to be performed by the City or to have been met precedent to and in the issuing of the Bonds in order to make them legal, valid and binding general obligations of the City have been performed and have been met, or will at the time of delivery of the Bonds have been performed and have been met, in regular and due form as required by law; that the full faith and credit and general property taxing power (as described in Section 7) of the City are pledged for the timely payment of the debt charges on the Bonds; and that no statutory or constitutional limitation of indebtedness or taxation will have been exceeded in the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 11. Retention of Bond Counsel. The legal services of Squire Patton Boggs (US) LLP, as bond counsel, be and are hereby retained. The legal services shall be in the nature of legal advice and recommendations as to the documents and the proceedings in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the rendering of the necessary legal opinion upon the delivery of the Bonds. In rendering those legal services, as an independent contractor and in an attorney-client relationship, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those legal services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those legal services. The Fiscal Officer is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 12. Retention of Municipal Advisor. The services of Sudsina & Associates, LLC, as municipal advisor, be and are hereby retained. The municipal advisory services shall be in the nature of financial advice and recommendations in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. In rendering those municipal advisory services, as an independent contractor, that firm shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of the City in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, the City or any other political subdivision, or the execution of public trusts. That firm shall be paid just and reasonable compensation for those municipal advisory services and shall be reimbursed for the actual out-of-pocket expenses it incurs in rendering those municipal advisory services. The Finance Director is authorized to provide for the payment of those fees and any reimbursements from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and otherwise is authorized and directed to make appropriate certification as to the availability of funds for those fees and any reimbursement and to issue an appropriate order for their timely payment as written statements are submitted by that firm.

Section 13. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the enactment of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees,

and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law.

Section 14. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings in this Ordinance are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof. Reference to a Section means a section of this Ordinance unless otherwise indicated.

Section 15. Declaration of Emergency; Effective Date. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to sell the Notes at the earliest possible date, which is necessary to (i) enable the City to retire the Outstanding Notes and thereby preserve its credit and (ii) enter into contracts for the improvement of the municipal sanitary sewerage system which is needed to eliminate existing and potential hazards to the municipal sanitary sewerage system and to enhance the efficiency of the municipal sanitary sewerage system; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

This is a summary of Ordinance No. 8051, enacted by the Council of the City of Defiance on August 14, 2018, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$3,175,000 for the purpose of paying costs of improving and expanding the municipal sanitary sewerage system by constructing and improving pump stations, force mains and sanitary sewers, together with all incidental work and related appurtenances thereto and acquiring any real estate or interests therein required therefor.

The bonds are to be dated their date of issuance and to bear interest at a rate or rates such that the true interest cost of the Bonds does not exceed 5%, and to mature in not more than 26 annual installments. The ordinance provides for sale of the bonds to the original purchaser designated by the Finance Director in a certificate of award, and authorizes the Finance Director to determine the principal amount of and interest rate or rates (subject to the above) on the bonds and their redemption features, if any. The ordinance provides for the manner of payment of the bonds, their form and signing and the application of the proceeds, and provides assurances of the City relating to the federal income tax status of the interest on the bonds. The ordinance also provides for the levy of a tax within the ten-mill limitation imposed by law on all the taxable property in the City while the bonds are outstanding, and that the bonds will be general obligations of the City, the full faith and credit and general property taxing power of which are pledged for the payment of principal and interest.

The complete text of the ordinance may be obtained or viewed at the office of the Clerk of Council. The ordinance was declared to be an emergency measure.

Below are the specific line items associated with this week's amending appropriation ordinance. If you have any questions, please contact me.

General Fund:

\$40,000 in the Development department to account for payment to the CIC for an option on land owned by G. Masterson and related to development on E. Commerce Drive.

\$5,400 to account for additional police testing expenses in Civil Service that were not anticipated.

\$125 to fully cover the cost of BORMA Liability insurance.

Other Funds:

\$16,000 at the request of the Municipal Court to cover higher than anticipated costs of indigent driver alcohol treatment.

\$15,000 in the new Probation Incentive Grant Fund to cover the cost of related software as required by the grant.

\$30,820 in the Probation Grant Fund to reflect additional grant funds made available.

\$20,505 to account for expenditure of remaining funds in the Housing Rehab Grant Fund Program.

\$28,504 in the Permanent Improvement Fund to account for insurance money received on a damaged police cruiser that has been replaced.

\$64,665 in the Permanent Improvement Fund to account for FEMA funds received for demolition of the property at 418 Auglaize Street ("Zachrich Building").

\$290,000 in the Splash Pad Trust Fund to fully account for project costs. Those costs are the same as has been previously reported (not increased).

\$13,000 in the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund to account for property tax reimbursement the City owed to the Knights of Columbus as part of the lease agreement for the K of C ballfields. I will explain further Tuesday night.

\$27,400 in the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund to account for grant dollars the Tuttle Museum received from Defiance County for improvements to the Fort Grounds signage.

\$18,398.64 in the Fire Damage Repair Fund to account for insurance monies received in connection with a fire on Westfield Street.
